This Notice must be submitted by any Provider or Provider Organization with Net Patient Service Revenue at or above the MCN Filing Threshold in the preceding fiscal year that is proposing a Material Change, as defined in 958 CMR 7.02. Notice must be filed with the Commission not fewer than 60 days before the consummation or closing of the transaction (i.e., the proposed effective date of the proposed Material Change).

The Commission will inform each notifying Provider or Provider Organization of any determination to initiate a Cost and Market Impact Review within 30 days of its receipt of a completed Notice and all required information, or by a later date as may be set by mutual agreement of the Provider or Provider Organization and the Commission.

Description of Organization

11. *Briefly* describe your organization.

Founded in 2015, Sword Health Technologies, Inc. ("Sword") and the Sword Practices (as hereinafter defined) deliver technology-powered care across musculoskeletal, women's, cardiometabolic, and mental health. Sword's healthcare services are delivered by Doctors of Physical Therapy ("DPTs"), registered dietitians, and behavioral health specialists, supported by proprietary technology and FDA-listed medical devices.

Sword is a Delaware corporation privately held by its shareholders, which include investors, founders, and employee stockholders, and governed by a board of directors. Sword's wholly-owned subsidiary, Sword Health, operates as an MSO. The affiliated, clinician-owned professional associations are incorporated in Florida: (1) Sword Health Care Providers, P.A., which provides telehealth physical therapy (and maintains state-specific subsidiaries: Sword Health Care Providers of CA, P.C. and Sword Health Care Providers of NJ, P.C.) and (2) Sword Mind Care Providers, P.A., a telehealth psychology practice, which is registered to do business in Massachusetts. These Sword-affiliated professional practices ("Sword Practices") are owned exclusively by licensed clinicians rather than Sword or other corporate bodies. Both entities provide clinical care for Sword clients under a management services agreement, and neither maintains ownership links with external healthcare organizations.

Sword has several service lines including:

- Musculoskeletal Care managed by DPTs, including acute, chronic, post-surgical, and prevention-focused care.
- Women's health managed by specialists (DPTs specializing in pelvic health, and, starting mid-2026, nurses providing holistic women's health support).
- Cardiometabolic conditions, integrating exercise, nutrition, and lifestyle interventions, all managed by health specialists trained as DPTs, as well as nurses and registered dietitians for comprehensive care services starting in 2026.
- Mental health care combining licensed Ph.D. level psychologists and technology.

Sword has no physical locations in Massachusetts.

Material Change Narrative

14. *Briefly* describe the nature and objectives of the proposed Material Change, including any exchange of funds between the parties (such as any arrangement in which one party agrees to furnish the other party with a discount, rebate, or any other type of refund or remuneration in exchange for, or in any way related to, the provision of Health Care Services) and whether any changes in Health Care Services are anticipated in connection with the proposed Material Change:

Headspace, Inc. ("Headspace") is a digital mental health and wellness company and management services organization ("MSO") and wholly-owned subsidiary of OrangeDot Inc. ("OrangeDot"). Sword proposes to acquire Headspace through a merger with Apollo Merger Sub, with OrangeDot as the surviving entity and becoming a wholly owned subsidiary of Sword (the "Proposed Transaction"). The Proposed Transaction will result in a change in the ultimate ownership and control of Headspace. The Proposed Transaction will combine Headspace's mental health, coaching, and wellness platform with Sword's technology-enabled virtual care platform. Headspace's current service offerings, which include behavioral health coaching, virtual therapy, virtual psychiatry, and on-demand wellness content, will continue without interruption following the closing of the Proposed Transaction. No reductions in the type or level of healthcare services provided to Massachusetts residents are anticipated as a result of the Proposed Transaction.

The aggregate purchase price for the Transaction is a cash payment subject to customary post-signing adjustments, including adjustments for closing cash, indebtedness, transaction expenses, and net working capital. The Merger Agreement provides for an estimated closing adjustment followed by a customary post-closing true-up.

15. *Briefly* describe the anticipated impact of the proposed Material Change, including but not limited to any anticipated impact on reimbursement rates, care referral patterns, access to needed services, and/or quality of care:

There are no anticipated material changes to reimbursement rates, referral patterns, access to needed services, quality of care, payer mix, service areas, service lines, or service mix as a result of the Proposed Transaction. Beyond the anticipated integration benefits described above, Headspace expects to continue operating its business substantially as it currently exists, preserving its existing virtual service offerings, nationwide geographic reach, and relationships with customers and payers.

Following the Proposed Transaction, there are no plans to reduce or eliminate the clinical services currently available to patients in Massachusetts. Neither Headspace nor the Headspace Affiliated Medical Practices maintain any physical clinical locations in Massachusetts. Headspace expects to preserve its existing virtual behavioral health services and continue supporting access to behavioral health care for patients throughout Massachusetts following the Proposed Transaction. The parties expect the Proposed Transaction to continue facilitating timely access to virtual behavioral health services for patients, including those in rural and underserved communities who may otherwise face geographic, transportation, provider-shortage, or scheduling barriers to care.

Integration planning remains ongoing, and the combined company anticipates that there may be reductions in corporate staff where functions are duplicative between the two organizations. Any such workforce reductions are expected to be limited to corporate functions and are not expected to affect patient care, customer relationships, payer relationships, or the availability of clinical services.

Each party submitted a filing under Hart-Scott-Rodino Antitrust Improvements Act, 15 U.S.C. § 18a on July 9, 2026. Additionally, the parties jointly submitted a Health Care Market Oversight filing to the Oregon Health Authority pursuant to Ore. Rev. Stat. § 415.500 et seq. on July 22, 2026, and a Health Care Entity Transaction Filing to the Minnesota Attorney General pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 145D.01 Subd. 2 on July 22, 2026. Headspace submitted a Massachusetts MCN filing on July 22, 2026.

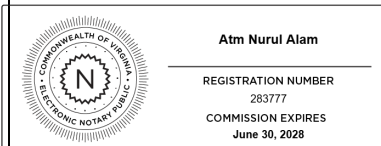
